DIGEST

Protest that awarded bidder cannot perform contract at bid price is denied. Continental Flooring's letter of protest is included by reference. [Attachment 1]

AUTHORITY

The Chief Procurement Officer¹ conducted an administrative review pursuant to S.C. Code Ann. §11-35-4210(4). This decision is based on materials in the procurement file and applicable law and precedents.

ANALYSIS

The College of Charleston issued this Invitation for Bids on April 11, 2018, for the removal and replacement of floor coverings in the Kelly House Apartments in downtown Charleston. The suite-flooring specifications required Armstrong Natural Creations Classics- Wood, 6" x 48" planks, Fruitwood Natural TP071 or equal with salient features listed as follows:

Luxury Vinyl Plank Tile for All Remaining Suite Flooring: Preferred product (for standardization throughout housing properties) and Basis of Specification is (Manufacturer) Armstrong / (Pattern) Natural Creations Classics- Wood, 6" x 48" planks / (Color) Fruitwood Natural TP071. Installation shall be in a random, ashlar plank pattern. The specified product has a wear layer thickness of 0.5mm, overall thickness of 3.2mm, UV-cured finish layer for protection from staining/discoloration, a minimal texture (no linear/grained embossing) for easier no-wax / no-buff cleaning, a manufacturing defects warranty of one year (labor and materials), two years (50% labor and 100% materials) and a commercial wear warranty of 20 years. The specified product positively contributes to the sustainability mission of the College, a 100% ortho-phthalate free product, in compliance with the following environmental standards/regulations:

Acceptable alternates must equal or exceed a wear layer thickness of 0.5mm, an overall thickness of 2.5mm, a minimum plank size of 6" x 48" (for minimal seams), a minimal texture (no linear/grained embossing) for easier no-wax / no-buff cleaning, a manufacturing defects warranty of at least one year (100% labor cost and materials) and commercial wear warranty of at least 12 years. Acceptable alternates must have UV-cured top finish layer, and meet or exceed the slip resistance and ecological properties of the Basis of Specification.

On May 7, 2018, Ceiling & Floor Restorations, Inc. (CFR) affirmed that its bid was for the brand name products requested. (Attachment 2) An Intent to Award was posted to CFR on May 10, 2018.

Continental Flooring protests:

Based on the pricing in the marketplace for the Armstrong Natural Creations product it is a practical impossibility for Ceiling & Floor Restorations, Inc. to be able to provide a product that meets or exceeds all the salient characteristics of the specified Armstrong product for the sum of their Bid.

Accordingly, we protest any award to Ceiling & Floor Restorations, Inc. on this basis.

CFR was determined to be a responsible bidder and has agreed to perform in accordance with the contract at the price bid. Continental's allegation that CFR will be unable to fully perform the contract because of its pricing is based upon speculation and conjecture. This is matter of contract administration, and there is no basis for rejecting CFR's bid based on a belief that it may

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violate the contract. *See, e.g., Appeal by Otis Elevator Company*, Panel Case No. 2017-1; *Appeal by Catamaran*, Panel Case No. 2015-2.

DECISION

For the reasons stated above, the protest of Continental Flooring Company is denied.

STATEMENT OF RIGHT TO FURTHER ADMINISTRATIVE REVIEW

Protest Appeal Notice (Revised July 2017)

The South Carolina Procurement Code, in Section 11-35-4210, subsection 6, states:

(6) Finality of Decision. A decision pursuant to subsection (4) is final and conclusive, unless fraudulent or unless a person adversely affected by the decision requests a further administrative review by the Procurement Review Panel pursuant to Section 11-35-4410(1) within ten days of posting of the decision in accordance with subsection (5). The request for review must be directed to the appropriate chief procurement officer, who shall forward the request to the panel or to the Procurement Review Panel, and must be in writing, setting forth the reasons for disagreement with the decision of the appropriate chief procurement officer. The person also may request a hearing before the Procurement Review Panel. The appropriate chief procurement officer and an affected governmental body shall have the opportunity to participate fully in a later review or appeal, administrative or judicial.

FILE BY CLOSE OF BUSINESS: Appeals must be filed by 5:00 PM, the close of business. *Protest of Palmetto Unilect, LLC*, Case No. 2004-6 (dismissing as untimely an appeal emailed prior to 5:00 PM but not received until after 5:00 PM); *Appeal of Pee Dee Regional Transportation Services, et al.*, Case No. 2007-1 (dismissing as untimely an appeal faxed to the CPO at 6:59 PM).

FILING FEE: Pursuant to Proviso 111.1 of the 2016 General Appropriations Act, "[r]equests for administrative review before the South Carolina Procurement Review Panel shall be accompanied by a filing fee of two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250.00), payable to the SC Procurement Review Panel. The panel is authorized to charge the party requesting an administrative review under the South 11-35-4210(6), 11-35-4220(5), Carolina Code 11-35-4230(6) 4410...Withdrawal of an appeal will result in the filing fee being forfeited to the panel. If a party desiring to file an appeal is unable to pay the filing fee because of financial hardship, the party shall submit a completed Request for Filing Fee Waiver form at the same time the request for review is filed. The Request for Filing Fee Waiver form is attached to this Decision. If the filing fee is not waived, the party must pay the filing fee within fifteen days of the date of receipt of the order denying waiver of the filing fee. Requests for administrative review will not be accepted unless accompanied by the filing fee or a completed Request for Filing Fee Waiver form at the time of filing." PLEASE MAKE YOUR CHECK PAYABLE TO THE "SC PROCUREMENT REVIEW PANEL."

LEGAL REPRESENTATION: In order to prosecute an appeal before the Panel, business entities organized and registered as corporations, limited liability companies, and limited partnerships must be represented by a lawyer. Failure to obtain counsel will result in dismissal of your appeal. *Protest of Lighting Services*, Case No. 2002-10 (Proc. Rev. Panel Nov. 6, 2002) and *Protest of The Kardon Corporation*, Case No. 2002-13 (Proc. Rev. Panel Jan. 31, 2003); and *Protest of PC&C Enterprises*, *LLC*, Case No. 2012-1 (Proc. Rev. Panel April 2, 2012). However, individuals and those operating as an individual doing business under a trade name may proceed without counsel, if desired.
