Drug & Alcohol Testing and Background Checks: Notice regarding Subcontractor

As of the end of October 2022, Applya (generally spelled w/o a capital *A*)is no longer a subcontractor with Premier Biotech under the contract for this service. Premier Biotech has subcontracted directly or is in the process of finalizing negotiations with all of applya's former subcontractors. There shouldn't be an interruption in services, but there's always the possibility of a hiccup here or there.

As part of this process, and at our direction, Premier Biotech has also implemented a policy to prevent providers from discontinuing services, turning away employees or potential employees from collection sites, and seeking the assistance of any state or political subdivision employee in efforts to receive payment under the contract. If a subcontractor contacts anyone in your agency for assistance for payment, or denies someone service, have them contact Premier Biotech directly using the escalation information on our contract sheet, and then notify Michael Speakmon (mspeakmon@mmo.sc.gov) as soon as possible afterward.

On another note, Premier requested, and we approved, a price adjustment for pricing on the contract. Most, but not all, of the lots are affected and the increases were done by line item rather than a straight percentage across the board. This was actually a better method as not all line items increased by the same percent. Overall, the prices are about 15% higher which is not too bad considering what's going on right now. New pricing is effective November 1, 2022.

Finally, not everyone who deals with this contract receives this newsletter so please pass this along to your organizations personnel who work most closely with the contract.





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NEW Emergency Response and Clean-Up Services Contracts

Emergency Response and Clean-Up Services are now available on statewide term contract. This contract is created to furnish response and clean-up services for disaster or emergency situations pertaining to damage from fire, water, storm and environmental damage. The following services are included in this contract: drying, containment, decontaminations, removal, treatment, transportation, disposal, and disinfecting/sanitizing.

We currently have 3 contracts awarded by lot to Belfor Property Restoration (4400029928, Lots 1-6), Crank Marketing Group (4400029929, Lots 1,2,5) and Steri-Clean (4400029927, Lots 2,3). The lots awarded are Lot 1- Labor, Lot 2- Dehumidification, Lot 3-Miscellaneous, Lot 4-Vehicles, Lot 5-Specialty Services and Lot 6-Specialty Services-Air Duct Cleaning.

The contractors' servicing areas and awarded lots are listed on our website at <u>this link</u>. These contracts are effective from September 22, 2022, to September 21, 2025. More contracts can be added based on the schedule within the solicitation document.

*Please Note: New vendors will need to use solicitation number 5400024275 to submit their bid in SCEIS. They will not be able to bid on solicitation 5400021940, but end users can still review the current awarded contractor information and details within the solicitation document https://webprod.cio.sc.gov/SCSolicitationWeb/contractSearch.do?solicitnumber=5400021940 .

Use of this contract is NOT mandatory by governmental bodies but is provided for their convenience.

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NEW STC for Auto Parts

We've published solicitation 5400024199 – STC for Automotive Parts (details can be found in the *Currently Published Solicitations* section of the newsletter). These new contracts will replace the current contracts we have under the NASPO Master Agreements and are slated to begin on January 1, 2023.

NEW Vehicle Contracts Are Ready for Use (October Update)

The new vehicle contracts are proving to be VERY popular. Between the contract start date of September 13th and this writing, over \$40 MILLION in POs have been processed against the contracts. The information below is provided one last time, but most of it appears on the Vehicle Contract Sheet here.

- 1. We have 13 contracts with Contractors who represent 12 different manufacturers.
- 2. We solicited as a Fixed Price Bid and will allow new offers every six months of both terms of the contract. If a vendor is not already on contract, they have three more opportunities to make an offer.
- 3. Each contract is for the FULL LINE of vehicles from the manufacturer rather than select vehicles as in years past. Note: Ignore the product category codes assigned to each of the contract awards. Those were used for administrative purposes only and do NOT restrict what is available under the contract.
- 4. Each contract includes NEW vehicles only. A new vehicle is defined as a vehicle that hasn't been previously titled. What that means is that the contract will allow you to purchase a 2022 vehicle that's considered new, you aren't restricted to 2023 models and newer.
- 5. Each contract includes vehicles in the Contractors existing inventory, meaning on the lot. If one of the Contractors has a new vehicle on the lot, you can purchase it under the contract.
- 6. Orders are NOT restricted to what's available through fleet designated resources. Orders can be placed for retail vehicles if the Contractor is willing to sell them to us in accordance with the contract.
- 7. We have literally contracted with everyone for everything for the actual cost of the vehicle, plus no more than 6%.

It's important to remember that all vehicle manufacturers are prioritizing their vehicle sales based on total profit potential. Even though we have "access" to the retail side, some Contractors may not want to sell us those vehicles because they can make a better profit selling to the public.

All vehicle contracts awarded under a previous solicitation will expire on October 31, 2022.

There are currently multi-agency contracts for the subject services that were awarded under solicitation 5400014768 and we're looking at the possibility of creating a Statewide Term Contract in lieu of the multi-agency contracts. We're already collaborating with DPS, PPP, SLED, DNR, Forestry and UofSC. This would be a mandatory STC, so if your state agency has a law enforcement division, this will impact you. State Term Contracts that will NOT be renewed or resolicited

Nothing new to report at this time.

Currently Published Solicitations

Automotive Parts (5400021499) – DeAna Reed-Sharpe (drsharpe@mmo.sc.gov) published this solicitation on October 14, 2022. The pre-bid was scheduled for October 27, 2022, with an anticipated bid opening on November 28, 2022. The intent is for the contracts resulting from this solicitation to replace the current contracts that are awarded under the NASPO Master Agreements. We clearly stated in the solicitation that having an in-state presence wasn't a requirement but is very beneficial for the contract customers. It's structured as a fixed price bid (FPB) so vendors who miss the initial offering may submit at a later date.

Athletic Uniforms, Equipment and Accessories (5400023815) – DeAna Reed-Sharpe (drsharpe@mmo.sc.gov) is evaluating offers received and is scheduled to post the intent to award on November 4, 2022.

Temporary Medical Services (5400024065) – Portia Davis (pdavis@mmo.sc.gov) conducted the pre-bid for this one on September 29, 2022, and published Amendment #1 on October 17, 2022, in response to questions received. The bid opening is





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scheduled for November 2, 2022, with awards expected to be published on November 7, 2022. The purpose of this solicitation is to contract with locum tenens providers to provide temporary medical personnel in a variety of positions. This will be a non-mandatory contract for two years while we gather data to evaluate the possibility of doing a more long-term version, which is our intent.

Marketing Services (5400023703) – Ellicia Howard (ehoward@mmo.sc.gov) received several questions that took some time to respond to and we had to issue an amendment to change the bid opening date to TBD. Amendment #2 was issued October 24th with a new bid opening date of November 9th.

Career Readiness Testing (5400023732) – Michael Speakmon (mspeakmon@mmo.sc.gov) is evaluating responses received. The original award posting date has been extended indefinitely but we appear to be close to the end of the process.

Cots (5400023907) – Ellicia Howard (ehoward@mmo.sc.gov) is evaluating offers received and we anticipate posting the intent to award on November 4, 2022, as scheduled.

Water Activated Pothole Patching (5400023975) – DeAna Reed-Sharpe (drsharpe@mmo.sc.gov) is evaluating offers received and will post the intent to award as scheduled on October 28, 2022.

VMware Products & Services (5400023716) – This solicitation was issued on July 18, 2022. An amendment was posted to extend opening date to September 23, 2022. NATIONAL RECOGNITION FOR SFAA'S KEITH McCOOK!

During its 75th Annual Conference, the National Association of State Procurement Officials (NASPO) awarded the 2022 Giulio Mazzone Distinguished Service Award (Mazzone Award) to Keith McCook. The Mazzone Award recognizes service, on a continuing exemplary basis, to the public purchasing profession. The program was created in 1982 as the NASPO Distinguished Service Award, and in 1994 was renamed for Giulio Mazzone.

McCook is the General Counsel for the State Fiscal Accountability Authority and has spent most of his legal career advancing and advocating for the procurement profession and sound, practical procurement policies and practices. Maggie McConnell, a 1996 recipient of the Mazzone Award, in presenting McCook as one of two awardees for the night, said "[Keith] may often have been overlooked for accomplishments in the public procurement world because the [he] has not served as a Chief Procurement Officer. [His] achievements, however, have changed the face of public procurement nationally."

Recognizing the need for formal procurement law education within NASPO's conferences and events, McCook



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has been credited for almost singlehandedly driving the creation of NASPO's procurement law attorney online community and resources, and the creation of NASPO's State Procurement Law Institute. "NASPO members get better legal advice and understand how a key stakeholder – their attorneys – affects the procurement profession," said McConnell.

"For me, receiving the Mazzone award is an honor of a lifetime," McCook said. "One I never imagined I would get. Without the support and encouragement of Dianne Lancaster, Richard Pennington, and above all - Voight Shealy, I would have gotten very little done at NASPO. It's been a lot of fun." He further stated, "NASPO does such a great job of giving us an opportunity to make a difference all across the country and to support each other at home. I encourage all of you to get involved and. if you are already involved, get more involved. One thing I've learned is you're going to get a lot more out of it than you expect. I certainly have."

Delbert Singleton, NASPO's 2022 President and Director for the Division of Procurement Services, noted that the Mazzone award recognizes those in the procurement profession who make significant and impactful contributions to the public procurement profession with an eye toward advancing the profession. "There are very few people who bring the level of dedication, passion, and tenacity to the procurement profession than Keith does. Having watched him grow into the procurement expert he has become, I would say that this has truly been a calling for Keith," Singleton said.
