DIGEST

Protest of an award alleging that the apparent successful bidder is not properly licensed to perform the requested work is granted. LCM Builders' (LCM) letter of protest is included by reference. [Attachment 1]

AUTHORITY

The Chief Procurement Officer¹ conducted an administrative review pursuant to S.C. Code Ann. §11-35-4210(4). This decision is based on the evidence and applicable law and precedents.

ANALYSIS

This Invitation for Bids was issued by Clemson University (Clemson) to acquire services to replace gutters and downspouts on several buildings located at Pee Dee research and education center in Florence SC. Bids were received from Cole's Sheet Metal and Welding (\$90,876.00), LCM (\$113,000.00), and Summit BSR Roofing (\$139,000). Clemson issued a statement of award to the lowest bidder, Cole's Sheet Metal & Welding, LLC (Coles), on February 15, 2017. LCM filed a timely protest alleging that Coles is not properly licensed to perform the required work.

Title 40, Chapter 11 of the South Carolina Code treats licensing for commercial contractors. Section 40-11-20 includes the following definitions:

- (8) "General construction" means the installation, replacement, or repair of a building, structure, highway, sewer, grading, asphalt or concrete paving, or improvement of any kind to real property.
- (9) "General contractor" means an entity which performs or supervises or offers to perform or supervise general construction.

Section 11-40-30 requires a contractor's license for anyone to perform construction work in excess of \$5000:

No entity or individual may practice as a contractor by performing or offering to perform contracting work for which the total cost of construction is greater than five thousand dollars for general contracting or greater than five thousand dollars for mechanical contracting without a license issued in accordance with this chapter.

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There are limited exceptions to the license requirement, none of which are relevant here. S.C. Code Ann. § 40-11-360 (2011).²

The solicitation including removal and replacement of approximately 4,120 linear feet of commercial grade gutters and approximately 2,155 linear feet of commercial grade downspouts, and painting the new materials. This work plainly meets the statutory definition of general construction, since it involves "installation, replacement, or repair of a building...or improvement of any kind to real property." Because the bid requires general construction and the cost of the contract is well above the \$5,000 threshold, a contractor's license is required. It is undisputed that Cole's Sheet Metal and Welding does not have a license issued by the Contractor's Licensing Board.

Contracts may only be awarded to bidder who is responsible. S.C. Code Ann. § 11-35-1520(10). A responsible offeror is defined in Section 11-35-1410(6) as:

"Responsible bidder or offeror" means a person who has the capability in all respects to perform fully the contract requirements and the integrity and reliability which will assure good faith performance which may be substantiated by past performance.

The factors to be considered in making a determination of responsibility are found in Regulation 19-445.2125(A) State Standards of Responsibility:

Factors to be considered in determining whether the state standards of responsibility have been met include whether a prospective contractor has:

ALTHOUGH NO SPECIFIC LICENSE IS REQUIRED TO PERFORM THE FOLLOWING WORK, PORTIONS OF THE WORK MAY REQUIRE A GENERAL CONTRACTOR OR A MECHANICAL CONTRACTOR LICENSE WITH THE APPROPRIATE CLASSIFICATION(S) PURSUANT TO SC CODE ANN. § 40-11-410 WHEN THE TOTAL COST OF CONSTRUCTION IS GREATER THAN \$5000.

Attachment 2 does not exempt commercial gutters from otherwise applicable licensing requirements. It merely advises that none of the specialty license subclassifications in Section 40-11-410(4) is required to perform guttering work.

² The South Carolina Department of Labor, Licensing and Regulation (LLR), thorough its Contractors Licensing Board, regulates and licenses contractors. It has published a list of work for which no specialty license is required. (Attachment 2) The list includes "commercial gutters," with the following disclaimer:

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(4) qualified legally to contract with the State....

Since Cole's does not have a contractor's license, and one is required for performing the contract, it is not legally qualified to contract with the State. Cole's is not a responsible offeror and thus is not eligible for award.

DECISION

For the foregoing reasons the protest of LCM Builders, Inc. is granted.

There are no proper exemptions to The South Carolina's Licensing Act in this work.

"The South Carolina Contractor's Licensing Act requires general and mechanical construction to be performed by licensed contractors. Both the owner and the contractor are subject to penalties for violations of the law. Work performed on projects is exempt from this requirement only for the following reasons:

(1) The total cost of construction is less than \$5,000.00;

- (2) The property will be used solely by the owner and his immediate family as a residence for a period of at least two years;
- (3) For nonresidential projects, work performed by the owner is limited to nonstructural and nonmechanical portions of the project, or;
- (4) The project is a farm building or portable storage building less than five thousand square feet used only for livestock or storage.

All other work must be performed by properly licensed contractors.

Exempt 1. does not apply:

The bid provided by Cole's Sheet Metal & Welding is \$90,876.00

Exempt 4. does not apply:

The facility is not a farm it is listed in the specifications as a research and education center.

From South Carolina Code of Laws Title 40 - Professions and Occupations

CHAPTER 11---Contractors---ARTICLE 1

SECTION 40-11-410. License classifications and subclassifications.

The following license classifications are in effect:

(5) "General Contractors-Building" which includes commercial, industrial, institutional, modular, and all other types of building construction, including residential structures. This license classification includes all work under the subclassifications of Wood Frame Structures-Class II, Interior Renovation, Masonry, Pre-engineered Metal Buildings, General Roofing, and Structural Shapes.

The scope of this project includes non-typical steel gutter installed on buildings used (possibly owned) by Clemson University. The work will include fabrication of custom metal shapes. This type of gutter cannot be extruded on site like typical residential gutter. Due to the type of steel, 22 gauge, and the number of mechanical expansion joints required a sheet metal mechanic and specialty tools will be required to form the gutter. Also included in this project is removal of a portion of the current building's damaged trim and new metal fabricated and installed along the rake end sections. Some Painting will also be required.

Scope for this project is finalized in Addenda #4 (see Attachment "C") pages 3 through 5 and outlines work to be done in additional to the gutter installation (underline added). The pertinent sections are quoted below:

f) Paint existing eave trim, new gutters and downspouts in matching color.

g) <u>Eave trim</u>, gutters and downspouts shall <u>be painted with a fluoropolymer</u> (polyvinylidene fluoride or PVDF) paint such as Kynar paint. Paint color shall <u>be off-white and should match existing paint as closely as possible.</u>

Additional work is also addressed in Addenda 5 (see Attachment "D") (highlights added)

Question: Addendum 4 specifies to paint the rake edges in connection with installing new gutters/downspouts. Some sections of the rake edge metal has rusted through with holes in the metal while other sections have surface rust. Should a unit cost be provided to replace the rusted rake end sections?

ANSWER: Yes! It's only a strip of 22 gauge metal trim that 8 inches

<u>STANDING:</u> LCM has standing to make this protest as it bid the work and was the second lowest bidder.

S.C. Code § 11-35-4210 (7) Per Article 17

Legal and Contractual Remedies

(6) Automatic Stay of Procurement During Protests. In the event of a timely Protest pursuant to subsection (1), the State shall not proceed further with the solicitation or award of the contract until ten days after a decision is posted by the appropriate chief procurement officer, or, in the event of timely appeal to the Procurement Review Panel, until a decision is rendered by the panel except that solicitation or award of a protested contract is not

stayed if the appropriate chief procurement officer, after consultation with the head of the using agency, makes a written determination that the solicitation or award of the contract without further delay is necessary to protect the best interest of the State.

RELIEF REQUESTED:

LCM initially requests that contract not be issued even though award was made to Cole's Sheet Metal & Welding as they do not hold the required license.

LCM Builders, Inc. also requests in the event it is found that Cole's Sheet Metal & Welding did submit a bid on a project for which they did not hold the correct license as required by South Carolina, that LCM be awarded this project without prejudice.

LCM reserves its statutory right to amend this protest once within 15 days of notice of intent to award which was presumed to have been issued at the same time as The Statement of Award on Feb. 1, 2017.

STATEMENT OF RIGHT TO FURTHER ADMINISTRATIVE REVIEW

Protest Appeal Notice (Revised November 2016)

The South Carolina Procurement Code, in Section 11-35-4210, subsection 6, states:

(6) Finality of Decision. A decision pursuant to subsection (4) is final and conclusive, unless fraudulent or unless a person adversely affected by the decision requests a further administrative review by the Procurement Review Panel pursuant to Section 11-35-4410(1) within ten days of posting of the decision in accordance with subsection (5). The request for review must be directed to the appropriate chief procurement officer, who shall forward the request to the panel or to the Procurement Review Panel, and must be in writing, setting forth the reasons for disagreement with the decision of the appropriate chief procurement officer. The person also may request a hearing before the Procurement Review Panel. The appropriate chief procurement officer and an affected governmental body shall have the opportunity to participate fully in a later review or appeal, administrative or judicial.

FILE BY CLOSE OF BUSINESS: Appeals must be filed by 5:00 PM, the close of business. *Protest of Palmetto Unilect, LLC*, Case No. 2004-6 (dismissing as untimely an appeal emailed prior to 5:00 PM but not received until after 5:00 PM); *Appeal of Pee Dee Regional Transportation Services, et al.*, Case No. 2007-1 (dismissing as untimely an appeal faxed to the CPO at 6:59 PM).

FILING FEE: Pursuant to Proviso 111.1 of the 2016 General Appropriations Act, "[r]equests for administrative review before the South Carolina Procurement Review Panel shall be accompanied by a filing fee of two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250.00), payable to the SC Procurement Review Panel. The panel is authorized to charge the party requesting an administrative review under the South 11-35-4210(6), 11-35-4220(5), Carolina Code 11-35-4230(6) 4410...Withdrawal of an appeal will result in the filing fee being forfeited to the panel. If a party desiring to file an appeal is unable to pay the filing fee because of financial hardship, the party shall submit a completed Request for Filing Fee Waiver form at the same time the request for review is filed. The Request for Filing Fee Waiver form is attached to this Decision. Panel Nov. 6, 2002) and *Protest of The Kardon Corporation*, Case No. 2002-13 (Proc. Rev. Panel Jan. 31, 2003); and *Protest of PC&C Enterprises*, *LLC*, Case No. 2012-1 (Proc. Rev. Panel April 2, 2012). However, individuals and those operating as an individual doing business under a trade name may proceed without counsel, if desired.
